Office Liquidators To Donate Furniture In Contest

CBS4's Jim Benemann To Judge Contest

DENVER (CBS4) — A Colorado company announced it plans to donate \$35,000 worth of furniture for Denver-area, non-profit organizations through a contest.

Office Liquidators says the contest, called the Office Liquidators \$35,000 Office Makeover, will begin Wednesday.

The company and its judges will be accepting nominations on the Office Liquidators Web site, www.OfficeLiquidators.com.

"The winning organization will receive \$30,000 worth of furniture and design/installation services from Office Liquidators, with another four runner-up organizations each receiving \$1,250 worth of furniture," Steve Caulk with Office Liquidators said in a prepared statement.

Caulk said nominees will be judged on the basis of their devotion to ethical business practices in pursuit of the non-profit's mission, on the positive influence the organization has made on the community, and on the organization's need for efficient office space.

CBS4's Jim Benemann will be on the panel of judges along with former Colorado First Lady Frances Owens, Denver Post business columnist Penny Parker, Gensler Principal Linda Nelson and Colorado Business Bank President Andy Bacon.

Anyone is eligible to make the nomination. Nominations will be accepted through noon, Feb. 15.

The five finalists will be posted on the Office Liquidators Web site by March 3.

Public voting starts March 4 and ends March 29.
